17/265 <u>Minutes of the Meeting of 18th April 2018 and the Annual Parish Assembly held on 18th April (for accuracy)</u>

17/267 **Town Quay**

Cllr Fassam gave a resume of the committed expenditure to date on the Town Quay improvements and he proposed, the Mayor seconded and it was RESOLVED that an additional £3,000.00 should be allocated to the Town Quay Working Party.

A request to advertise banana boat rides on an existing advertising board on the quay had been received. There would be no touting and the rides would take place outside the harbour. The only impact the operation would have on the quay would be that passengers would be collected from the town quay steps. Members expressed concerns about Health & Safety implications if additional people were using the steps but, after further consideration, Cllr Berryman proposed, Cllr Fassam seconded and it was RESOLVED that the applicant should be permitted to run the operation from the quay on a trial basis on the strict understanding that he would have to cease trading immediately if risk assessments showed it to be unsafe. The Mayor abstained from voting.

A request had been received for the positioning of a hut, similar to the one used by the licensed boatmen, by the owner of the self-drive boats. The general consensus was that this would tidy up the quay as the bins currently used for lifebelts could be stored inside the hut. The request had been for an 8 foot x 4 foot structure but this was considered too large and that it should be a maximum of 6 foot x 4 foot, which would be larger than the existing hut but would accommodate both the operator and all his equipment. The Mayor then proposed, Cllr Simms seconded and it was RESOLVED that a 6 foot by 4 foot hut should be allowed on the basis that it was a mirror image of the existing hut and be licensed in the same way and at the same cost .

Cllr Berryman proposed, Cllr Asker seconded and it was RESOLVED that the Press and Public be excluded in accordance with the Local Government Act 1972, as amended, during consideration of the following business on the grounds that it would be likely to involve the disclosure of exempt information of the following description - Information relating to an individual.
