Civic Guests and members of the public

- The Town Crier announced the arrival of the Mayor, the Mayoress, the Deputy Mayor, the Town Clerk and the Council of Fowey.
- The Mayor, Cllr Berryman, welcomed everybody present.

Fellow Mayors, Chairs of Parish councils, councillors and special guests. It gives me great pleasure to welcome to you all on behalf of myself and my fellow councillors to our Annual Meeting of FTC and to our Mayor Making Ceremony which follows.

Having welcomed you all, I will now proceed to point out the means of escape, but only to be used in case of an emergency, doors to my rear left and the front left. The toilets, open and free I might add, are up the short staircase and along the passage.

Please ensure all mobile phones are switched off or onto silent, thank you. This year our ceremony is different from previous years in as much as we are Making a New Mayor not just copy and paste last years' Mayor.

- He then invited his Chaplain, Revd de Grey-Warter, to lead the prayers.
- The Mayor took the Chair.
- The Mayor appointed the Clerk, Mrs Sally Vincent, to take the minutes.
- The Mayor presented Good Citizens Awards to Mr Colin Liddicoat and Mr & Mrs Graham Jane for their outstanding service to the Fowey community.
- The Mayor presented a gift to Mr Michael Phillips for always being on hand to repair, renew and service FTC's IT equipment at no cost to the council.

The Mayor continued his opening address

I would like to take this last opportunity of saying a few words before we proceed with the main purpose of this evening, I do so whilst I am still Mayor and no one can stop me.

During the last 5 years there has been 2 ladies in my life, as Mayor that is, and I would like to thank them both, firstly Mo for giving me the space and encouragement to carry out the duties of Mayor and to Sally, our clerk, for steering and guiding me though the office of being Mayor.

To, hopefully my successor, one piece of advice - amidst the work and commitments do not forget to enjoy the office and all that brings of being Mayor of Fowey.

Going back over the records I note that as a Council we have regained ownership of several lost assets— TH/TQ came back into the town's ownership in 2012. The allotments and the 1acre Meadow, came back into the town's ownership in 2014. Squires Field and the Public conveniences are still under negotiation, but hope to complete within the month.

Before I sit down I would like to take this opportunity of thanking my fellow Councillors who along with everyone else in town have made these past 5 years a real pleasure and privilege to be Mayor of Fowey.

The Town Clerk announced that the first item of business was the election of the Mayor for the next civic year and invited nominations.

15/02 Election of Mayor of Fowey for the Civic Year 2015/2016

Cllr Gudmunsen proposed that Cllr Mrs Ruth Finlay should be Mayor of Fowey for 2015/2016 and gave the following citation.

Ruth came to Fowey from Northumberland 25 years ago. She attended Bangor University and received a degree in History and Archaeology. Ruth and her family live in Vicarage Meadow and she has been a Councillor for several years and served as Deputy Mayor in 2014/2015. Ruth is very much a people-person and for the last year has been working with residents to refurbish the existing allotments and adding new one. There are now 31 allotments in use and with the help of the Environment Committee of which she is Chairman and of the allotment holders they are creating an apple orchard specializing in Cornish apples. Ruth has been given a grant to help establish the orchard and has been working with her Committee to create something special. Ruth stepped up when the Mayor went on an extended holiday, writing the Mayors Column and got herself known by Fowey residents for writing an interesting piece in the Fowey News. Ruth was also responsible with her Environment Committee in re-organising the Old Grammar School Gardens and I am sure she will be doing much more for Fowey by getting to know its residents and business community in the coming year. I have great pleasure in proposing Cllr Ruth Finlay as Mayor of Fowey for 2015/2016.

Cllr Delves seconded the proposal.

LAST YEAR I SAID THAT THE RETIRING DEPUTY MAYOR, THE REDOUBTABLE COUNCILLOR ANNE BOOSEY, I MAY BE IN TROUBLE FOR CALLING HER THAT, WAS A HARD ACT TO

FOLLOW. WELL GUESS WHAT COUNCILLOR JOHN BERRYMAN, OUR EXCELLENT MAYOR FOR THE LAST FIVE YEARS, IS TOO. SO WE KNOW THAT RUTH ISN'T AFRAID OF THE SORT OF CHALLENGE THAT WOULD BE DAUNTING TO MANY PEOPLE. SHE IS FAST MAKING A NAME FOR HERSELF AS A SUCCESSFUL FOLLOWER OF HARD ACTS. RUTH HAS BEEN A GREAT DEPUTY MAYOR AND CHAIR OF THE ENVIROMENT COMMITTEE. SHE HAS BROUGHT CONSIDERABLE ENTHUSIASM SKILL AND NEW IDEAS TO BOTH ROLES.

BUT FOR ME IT'S RUTH'S WORK ON THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN THAT IS HER GREATEST ACHIEVEMENT OVER THE PAST YEAR. FRUSTRATED BY THE LACK OF PROGRESS ON THE PLAN RUTH, TOGETHER WITH COUNCILLORS KATHERINE ALEXANDER AND CAROLE EARDLEY, HAS BREATHED LIFE BACK INTO THE PROCESS THAT WAS REALLY GOING NOWHERE BUT IS SO IMPORTANT FOR THE FUTURE OF OUR TOWN. SHE PROPOSED THAT FOWEY SHOULD GO IT ALONE AND PREPARE ITS OWN PLAN WHICH WAS CONTROVERSIAL AT THE TIME BUT HAS PROVED TO BE ABSOLUTELY THE RIGHT THING TO DO. SHE SECURED FUNDING AND PUT TOGETHER AN IMPRESSIVE WORKING GROUP THAT HAS MADE FANTASTIC PROGRESS IN A VERY SHORT SPACE OF TIME.

SHE EVEN INTRODUCED HOT DRINKS AT MEETINGS WHICH IS A GOOD START. BUT A POINT TO NOTE FOR THE FUTURE PLEASE RUTH COUNCILLOR DAVID WILLMORE, CHAIRMAN OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE, BRINGS CHOCOLATE HOB NOBS TO HIS MEETINGS. I'M JUST SAYING......

WE KNOW THAT FOWEY TOWN COUNCIL FACES SOME SERIOUS CHALLENGES OVER THE COMING YEAR WHICH I DON'T INTEND TO COMMENT ON NOW FOR THE SAKE OF EVERYONE'S SANITY. I KNOW RUTH WILL MAKE A GREAT MAYOR. SHE HAS CERTAINLY EARNED THE RIGHT TO HAVE A GO AND TO LEAD THE COUNCIL OVER THE NEXT 12 MONTHS. SHE CARES ABOUT FOWEY AND THE COMMUNITY OF FOWEY AND IS PREPARED TO WORK FOR THE TOWN. WHERE MANY VOICE OPINIONS AND NOT MUCH ELSE, RUTH IS PREPARED TO ROLL UP HER SLEEVES AND GET ON WITH IT FOR VERY LITTLE THANKS TO BE HONEST. WELL, I'M SAYING IT NOW. THANK YOU RUTH

There being no further nominations the Town Clerk called for a vote, which was unanimous and it was RESOLVED that Cllr Mrs Ruth Finlay would be the Mayor of Fowey for the 2015/2016 civic year.

The Mayor recited and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and swore the Oath of Allegiance.

The Mayor returned thanks for her election.

I would like to thank my proposer, Cllr Sherlee Gudmunsen and my seconder Cllr Tony Delves and also the council for my election.

Can I also thank John Berryman who is a long serving Councillor on Fowey Town Council, five of them as Mayor. John has steered the council through some frustrating

problems with knowledge and understanding. I will be certainly be looking for his support in the coming year.

And on behalf of the Town Council can I take this opportunity to thank our Town Clerk Sally Vincent who works tirelessly on behalf of the council managing leases, licences as well as providing useful guidance for many of our decisions. As the work of the council becomes more complex, so the legal aspect of our work increases as does our reliance on her expertise.

I became a town councillor six years ago, personally to continue working in the community in which I have worked in for many years. I taught at Fowey Community College for 25 years. My three children were taught at the primary and secondary school in Fowey, and they have also worked part time in the different businesses in the town, before going off to university or in my son's case taking an apprenticeship with Fowey Harbour Commissioners.

My husband Paul now retired from teaching is enjoying setting up his pottery studio and escaping off sailing whenever he can. It is this link with the community which I think is important. During my term as Mayor I will endeavour to represent all sections of Fowey.

As Mayor I hope to lead the Council through what should be an exciting year ahead, with the remaining toilets and Squires field and car park about to be returned to the people of Fowey imminently. These assets, once in the possession of Fowey, will be managed and maintained by the Town Council to a standard which **we** will be able to monitor and react to if the need arises.

Squires Field, an important green space to the people of Fowey is used by local football teams and children, will need careful planning to deliver the amenities which are being asked for and are required. There is already a group of people who would like to set up a community centre at the top of the town to provide a space for all the community groups who don't have a home at present.

I am also chair of the steering group of the Fowey Parish Neighbourhood Plan started last December and we hope by this December we will be working on the draft plan.

The Neighbourhood Plan should represent the views of the people of Fowey, young and old. This week, I went to the primary school to talk to the Year 6's about What makes Fowey Special, their ideas have been painted onto tiles with the help of ceramic artist Heather Hunt. This work will form part of an exhibition in September together with local photographs and paintings all on the same theme. This will form part of our introduction to our draft plan. The neighbourhood plan is an important statutory part of a town's planning armoury, especially for one in such a lovely location as Fowey.

As Mayor, I hope to support and represent the people of Fowey in particular affordable homes to buy and to rent for local people, to support the business community in keeping Fowey a thriving and viable economy and to protect our beautiful environment in as sustainable a manner as possible.

The Mayor appointed her husband, Mr Paul Finlay to be her Consort *My first duty is to invite Paul to become my Consort.*

The Mayor appointed Philip de Grey Warter to be her Chaplain *My second duty is to invite The Vicar, Philip de Grey-Warter, to be my chaplain.*
