16/07 Budget 2016/2017

Budget allocated for 2016/2017 is $\pm 9,000$. To date expenditure of $\pm 4,230.90$ on work in the Old Grammar School Garden has almost been balanced out by donations, remainder of last year's grant, and two gifted benches leaving a total cost of Phase 3 of ± 253.41 .

16/08 FTC Contractors

As Cormac have changed the way they pay for grass cutting and path maintenance it is essential that Lanhydrock Garden Services make it clear on their invoices what work has been done where by indicating Date, Path and Ref. Number. Cllr. Alexander agreed she would speak to LGS to ask for the date they intend to trim the hedgerows.

16/09 Old Grammar School Garden

Phase 3 of the lower section of the garden has been completed, apart from the plantings, to compliment and balance out the work done in Phase 2 in 2015. The sleepers put in last year have mellowed nicely and it is expected those put in this year will do the same. Costs incurred are shown under 16/07.

Two memorial benches had to be removed. These will be placed up at the Allotments but the plaques will be put up elsewhere in the OGSG, together with 2 new memorial plaques being produced by Parc signs.

The upper garden is looking much tidier and more cared for due to the work done over the winter by people from Heaven Scent.

16/10 Allotments

Cllr Eardley had joined members of the Readymoney Allotment Society Committee to do a Health & Safety walk around on the 1st June. Seven plot holders had not paid the 2016 rental invoice and five of those did not appear to have done any work on the plot recently. The Secretary of RAS and Cllr. Eardley agreed to send out polite reminders.

The Chairman of RAS, David Burdekin had voiced his concerns about water damage to the roadway into the original allotments which has occurred over several years now. During heavy winter rain showers water flows down from the field above, washing away the hard-core road.

Cllr. Berryman suggested a couple of options, one being digging out an area in the field to act as a sump and the second laying perforated drainage pipe under the hard-core into which the rain would seep and then be carried out of the allotments.
